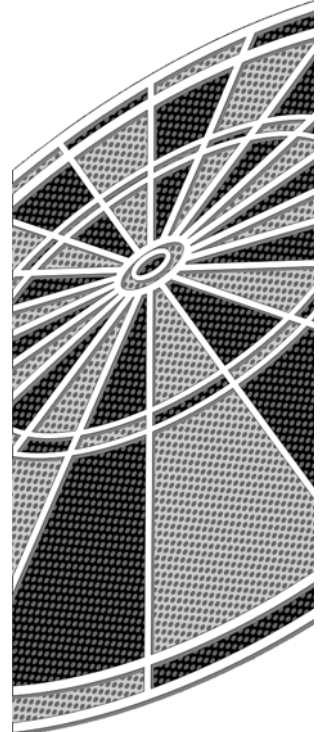
Entries are not tied to the teams nor the teammates that players were and/or are rostered with in The Medalist League. Players have the total freedom to construct new teams for the World Championships.

upon player rating – highest to lowest.

Grand Master participants are required to participate in World Championships Doubles and Single-Doubles Challenge Events.

Entries for the Grand Master Singles Event will take place at the tournament.

Grand Master participants must comply with the Grand Master Dress Code when playing in Grand Master Singles.

The World Championships game requirements are:

A minimum of 60 games from The 2005 Fall League and
A minimum of 60 games from The 2006 Spring League

Or, for players that did not play in The 2005 Fall League, The World Championships game requirements from The 2006 Spring League are:

A minimum of 120 games – regardless of the rating level

Byes, forfeits, postponements, Dummy Scores and/or voided stat games do not create exceptions to the game requirements.

The final ratings from The 2006 Spring League are the ratings for The 2006 World Championships.

Note: If a team's combined rating increases/decreases from the time of entry to the finalization of World Championships Ratings, said team will be moved to the appropriate flight once the World Championships Ratings are finalized.

Exception: The Sweet Sixteen Knockout Tournaments game requirements are a minimum of 60 games from The 2006 Spring League

**PLEASE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RATING VERIFICATION
SECTION IN THIS BOOK – IF IN DOUBT, RERATE YOURSELF!**

At the World Championships, stats will be recorded in all games and computed per Medalist's judgment.

It is anticipated that winning prize monies in any flight requires consistent overachieving by all legitimate players.

However, there are limits on acceptable differentials between a Tournament Rating (the rating used by a player to enter the World Championships) and an Event Rating (the rating level the player is shooting in the World Championships). If, with 15 or more Stat Games* computed, a

player's Event Rating exceeds their Tournament Rating by three or more points, said player's Tournament Rating will be rerated to their Event Rating at the conclusion of the day's events. Said rerating does not impact the teams and the standings within the flight from which the stats were derived.

Exception: Singles-Doubles Challenge and Super Saturday Doubles teams with rerated players that are in the Final Four will be eliminated and recognized as finishing in fourth place

However, reratings do impact teams in subsequent events and may impact individual eligibility.

A player may be rerated more than once. Once a player is rerated, the new rating applies throughout the World Championships (cannot go down). If a player is rerated twice, said player will be disqualified from the World Championships, will not receive prize money from the event in which the second rerate occurred and will not receive refunds for subsequent events. Said player's future eligibility will be determined after the World Championships.

A rerate becomes permanent following a review between Medalist and the respective operator after the World Championships.

In addition, Medalist reserves the right to decline or remove any entry, without compensation, that the Tournament Director feels would be a disruption of the parity at the World Championships Tournament. No refunds.

* May be adjusted by Medalist based on team count

The standard rerate policy as defined herein will apply.

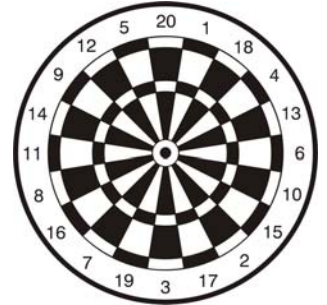
However, due to the significance of the prize monies being paid on Super Saturday and the opportunity to generate solid stats via the Doubles Qualifiers and the Singles-Doubles Challenge all players will play Super Saturday using their Event or Tournament Ratings, whichever are greater.

Non-rostered Replacement Players (NRPs) may be used (one per team per event) provided that:

- The NRP meets the game requirement
- The NRP's Tournament Rating is equal to or less than the Tournament Rating of the player being replaced

Exception: For Saturday Events the NRP's Event or Tournament Rating, whichever is greater, must be equal to or less than the effective Rating of the player being replaced

The NRP may only enter a match at the start – prior to the first dart being thrown.

There is only one reversal (return of the original player) allowed per event and said reversal must be at the start of a match – prior to the first dart being thrown – may not return in mid-match.

Players are guaranteed windows of play as published. If a player is involved in two events (regardless of type); the player must prepare, IN ADVANCE, for the potential conflict – have verified and recorded a NRP on either or both teams, the player's choice.

NO CONFLICTS, NO DELAYS, NO PLAYING MULTIPLE MATCHES!

IF A NRP IS NOT VERIFIED, RECORDED AND READY TO PLAY WHEN A MATCH IS CALLED, A DUMMY SCORE MUST BE USED!

Exception: AA Doubles match conflicts with Grand Master Singles will be allowed – **matches will be held as decided by Medalist**

In the A & AA Events, if the roster rating of the two highest rated opposing players are within two rating points; the cork will replace the coin flip. If not, the coin flip remains. In the Grand Master Singles, the cork will replace the coin flip.

The quarter revenue generated is included in the cash added and/or utilized to offset a portion of the tournament operational expenses.

Approximately 40% of the teams entered in a Doubles Qualifier flight will progress to the Super Saturday Finals and are "In The Money."

Players have the opportunity to play in four Doubles Qualifiers. However they have the freedom to play in fewer – not playing in a Qualifier does not forfeit teams out of subsequent Qualifiers.

Based on final team count in the respective flights Medalist will announce the qualifying positions from each Qualifier.
